Department of Economics

Program Outcomes

- The course intends to introduce the students with the broad contours of Economics its methodologies, tools and analysis procedures.
- Acquire skills in Critical Thinking, Quantitative Reasoning, Problem Solving and Communication
- The course also aims to create an enthusiasm among students about different schools of Economic thought and various aspects of social science research, methodology, concepts and tools like data analysis, research methodology.
- Students are able to understand Indian economy and economics principles, it enhances them to compute and assess the real situation of the economy including the size and changes of population, income pattern, nature of an extend of employment, rate of development with pattern of investments and savings, policies in relation to other countries, and social security measures adopted in the country.

Program Specific Outcomes

- Ability to conduct empirical studies for scientific social science researches as well as to analyze and interpret them
- Acquiring knowledge, competency and confidence to take up career in Indian Economic Service
- On completion of the course students are able to develop ideas of the basic characteristics of Indian economy, its potential on natural resources, grasp the importance of planning undertaken by the government of India
- Students have knowledge on the various objectives, failures and achievements as the foundation of the ongoing planning and economic reforms taken by the government.
- The students are able to demonstrate marginal productivity theory of distribution, theory of wages, identify different types of rent, and illustrate different theories of interest and profits.
- Ability to perform as a successful economic analyst for industry, trade and commerce, banking and non-banking financial institutions.
- They are able to apply economic concepts to contemporary social issues and formulation of policy.

Micro Economics

- This course will expose the students to the basic principles in Microeconomics and their applications. Study of micro economics enables the students to have an understanding of theoretical aspects of the subject.
- This paper helps to students to understand the market mechanism and how market determines prices in different types of markets. It also helps to understand the optimum equilibrium of producer and how can optimum equilibrium achieve.
- The students learn some basic principles of microeconomics and interactions of supply and demand, characteristics of perfect competition, efficiency and welfare.
- Students are able to understand and define the basic concepts like consumer behavior, production, demand and supply etc.
- This course will help the students to understand different forms of market imperfections and market failures observed in real life situations.
- They will also develop a sense of how the production is distributed among the different factors of production and the demand for inputs.
- Students will learn about the price and output determination of the firm and industry under different market forms. They also learn about the Welfare concept in modern Economics.

Macro Economics

- This course introduces students to the basic concepts in Macroeconomics.
- In this course the students are introduced to the definition, measurement of the macroeconomic variables like GDP, consumption, savings, investment and balance of payments.
- This course will enable the student to understand various real economic issues and evaluate policy outcomes.
- This is a sequel to Principles of Macroeconomics I. It analyses various theories of determination of National Income in greater detail.
- It also introduces students to concept of inflation, its relationship with unemployment and some basic concepts in an open economy.
- This course provides students with an analytical framework to understand the basic functioning of the macro economy.
- It also allows them to critically examine and comment on effectiveness of various policies.
- Students learn about macroeconomics and different theories regarding the determination of income and employment by different economists.
- They learn about the consumption and investment functions. And also, about the functioning of multiplier process.

Public Finance

- This paper deals with the principles of public finance, public expenditure, Public Debt & income and taxes.
- The students can learn about the principles and policies of budget of central and state government also.
- Understanding of the rationale for the existence of modern governments.
- Familiarity with the micro and macro aspects of public expenditure.
- Acquaintance with the phenomenon of externality and the role of government.
- An understanding of the mechanics of government budget.
- The overall outcome of the course is the development of an understanding of public sector financial resources.

Money Banking & International Trade

- The study of money, banking and international trade enables to understand the function of money, banking and international trade relations.
- It helps to know the principles of international trade which governs the exchange of goods between nations and problems of import-export policy.
- Explain the significance of money, money supply and money demand.
- Illustrate the operations of monetary and banking systems.
- Analyze the policies of the Government and RBI
- Explain the significance of International Trade relations between the countries of the world.
- Identify the functioning of International institutions.

Indian Economy

- This paper helps to know structure and the main problems of Indian economy such as poverty, unemployment and problems of agriculture and industries.
- Understand the features of Indian economy and suggest measures for problems.
- Functioning and the interrelationship between different sectors of the Indian economy.
- The students will come to know the Features of Indian Economy.
- The students will Learn Agriculture, Industrial and Service Sectors of the economy.
- The students will get familiar with various Poverty Alleviation and Employment Generation Schemes.

Basics of Labour Economics

- To understand the concept of Basic Labour Economics.
- The students will learn the importance of labour economics.
- The students will get familiar with characteristics of Industrial labour.
- The students will come to know about labour legislation and labour unions.
- The students will learn Social Security and Labour Welfare measures for labours

Basic Quantitative Techniques in Economics

- This paper deals with mathematical approach of economics. This paper helps to know the basics of statistics.

B.A-II Year —Semester-III Paper-I (Foundations of Western Political Thought)

- This paper providing an insight into the dominant features of Ancient Western Political Thought: Ancient Greek political thought with focus on Aristotle and Plato; Roman Political Thought: its contributions with special emphasis on the emergence of Roman law.
- This Course the ancient and modern political thinking in the west.
- Examining the features of Medieval Political Thought.
- Evaluating the Renaissance; political thought of Reformation; and Machiavelli.
- Critically examining Badin's contributions to the theory of Sovereignty; Hobbes as
 the founder of the science of materialist politics; Locke as the founder of Liberalism
 with focus on his views on natural rights, property and consent; and Rousseau's
 views on Freedom and Democracy; Bentham's Utilitarianism; and John Stuart Mill's
 views on liberty and representative government.
- Taking an insight into the following: Hegel's views on Civil Society and State; Utopian and Scientific socialism: basic characteristics.
- This would help to understand the idea of state rights, liberty, equality and justice. Which have evolved a period of time.
- This paper would help to understand the Greek political thinkers as Plato, Aristotle.
 This paper also increase the knowledge of students about the many political thoughts origin of the state, idealism, utilitarianism, Marxism etc.

B.A III Year Semester: VI – Paper II (Fundamentals of Indian Political Thought)

- Acquaintance to Indian national movement & constitution is indispensable for a student to make a sense of the Indian political system.
- The course is designed to provide an overview of Indian freedom struggle and key concepts of the Indian constitution to the student. This would evolve him into a conscientious citizen.
- Assessing the nationalist thought of Vivekananda and Tagore.

- Explaining the formation of the Congress in 1885.
- Tracing the Bengal Partition and the Swadeshi movement.
- Analysing the Gandhian Movements such as the Khilafat, Non Cooperation, Civil Disobedience movements.
- Assessing the alternatives to the Indian National Congress- the Forward Bloc, Congress Socialist Party, Communist Parti of India.
- Describing the movements against caste and untouchability, Ambedkar's views on Social Justic and the depressed classes.
- Analysing the Working Class and Peasant movements under colonial rule
- Discussing the roots of communalism- Savarkar and Hindu Nationalism and Jinnah and the two nation theory.
- Estimating the contribution of the August 1942 movement, the INA and the naval uprising.
- This paper helps the students to understand about the Indian constitution: preamble, fundamental rights, fundamental duties, loksabha, rajayasabha, president, prime minister, supreme court, party system in India, electoral behavior, the students understands issues of Indian politics as caste, class, gender, by this paper. They interest to know the problems of terrorism, insurgency and national integration.

B.A-III Semester : V Paper-I (The Major Theories of International Politics)

- Explaining scope and subject matter of International Relations as an autonomous academic discipline.
- Approaches and methods to study the discipline through Political realism, Pluralism and Worlds system's Model.
- Examining the issues of Underdevelopment, Terrorism, Regionalism and Integration that characterizes the Post second world war order.
- Studying the role of Diplomacy, Propaganda and Military capabilities in the making of foreign policy.
- Explaining certain basic concepts like Globalization in contemporary world order.
- Describing the Cold War phases and understanding the post Cold War era.
- Discussing the developments in European Ethno-nationalism since 1990's. Tracing the growth of European Union

- Examining Indian Foreign Policy: Basic Principles, Evolution and Bilateral Relations.
- Evaluating the working of UN and its organs; Peace keeping Function and Human Rights.
- Analysing the Foreign Policy of USA and China.
- Studying the developments in third world countries in post world war II era like NAM: Relevance, ASEAN, SAFTA and SAARC, OPEC, OAU, West Asia-Palestine problem after Cold War
- This course seeks to equip students the basic tools for understanding international relations.
- It also introduces major events and developments. Those have shaped the contemporary international system.
- It aims to capture the changing dynamics of the international politics by taking up burning and relevant issues which have potential to alter its contours.
- This course would help to the students to know about international politics, national interst, foreign policy, united nation organization and regional organizations: Saarc, Asian and Europeans union.

B.A III Year Semester: V Paper -II

(Elements of Public Administration)

- Explaining the nature, scope and evolution of Public Administration; Private and Public Administration; Principles of Socialist Management.
- Discussing making of Public Policy Making and methods of Implementation
- Analysing the major Concepts in Public Administration.
- Tracing the Challenges in the discipline of Public Administration like New Public Administration (NPA); Comparative Public Administration (CPA) and Development Administration.
- Discussing the Ecological approach to Pub. Adm.
- Analysing the Administrative Processes: decision making; communication and control; leadership; co-ordination.
- Discussing Weberian and Marxian theories of bureaucracy.
- Studying the Organization of the Union Government and State Government.
- Examining the Institutions of Local Self Government in India
- Assessing the relationship between the Citizen and Administration: Lokpal and Lokayukt.

- Understanding the concept of District Administration in India.
- Examining the Institutions of Financial Administration in India.
- Analysing the Civil Service in India.
- Explaining the Planning and Planned Administration in India. Continuity and Change in Indian Administration.
- Administration being essential to every organization. This course aims to acquaint a student with fundamentals of public administration too.
- Students could understand about public administration and private administration and personnel administration by help of this course. They also increase there knowledge to know the budget. Ombudsman with special reference to lokayukta and lokpal in India.
